## Review of Conference Theme

On October 8, 2019, the World Health Organization (WHO) released a World Report on vision that stated there are over 2.2 billion people with vision impairment or blindness worldwide, and over 1 billion of those have conditions that could be treated or prevented. Globally, the burden of vision impairment and blindness is greatest in low- and middle-income countries. Despite effective and low-cost interventions, refractive error and cataract remain the largest causes of vision impairment and blindness. There is expected to be an increasing demand for global eye care due to an aging population, changing lifestyles, disease condition like diabetes and population growth. The global eye health report indicate that there are several challenges to meet ophthalmic problems.

Current Trends in Ophthalmology cover key subjects such as cataract surgery and lens implantation; glaucoma; retinal, vitreous and macular disorders; corneal and external disorders; refractive surgery; oculoplastic and orbital surgery; neuro-ophthalmology; and ocular manifestations of systemic disease.

The major challenge faced by today's pharmacologist and formulation scientist is ocular drug delivery. To overcome the ocular drug delivery barriers and improve ocular bioavailability, various conventional and novel drug delivery systems have been developed such as emulsion, ointments, suspensions, aqueous gels, nanomicelles, nanoparticles, liposomes, dendrimers, implants, contact lenses, nanosuspensions, microneedles and in situ thermosensitive gels for the earlier mention ocular diseases.

Current Trends in Ophthalmology provide a platform where we can understand various current trends in ophthalmic surgery and ophthalmic medicines.

## **Inaugural Ceremony**

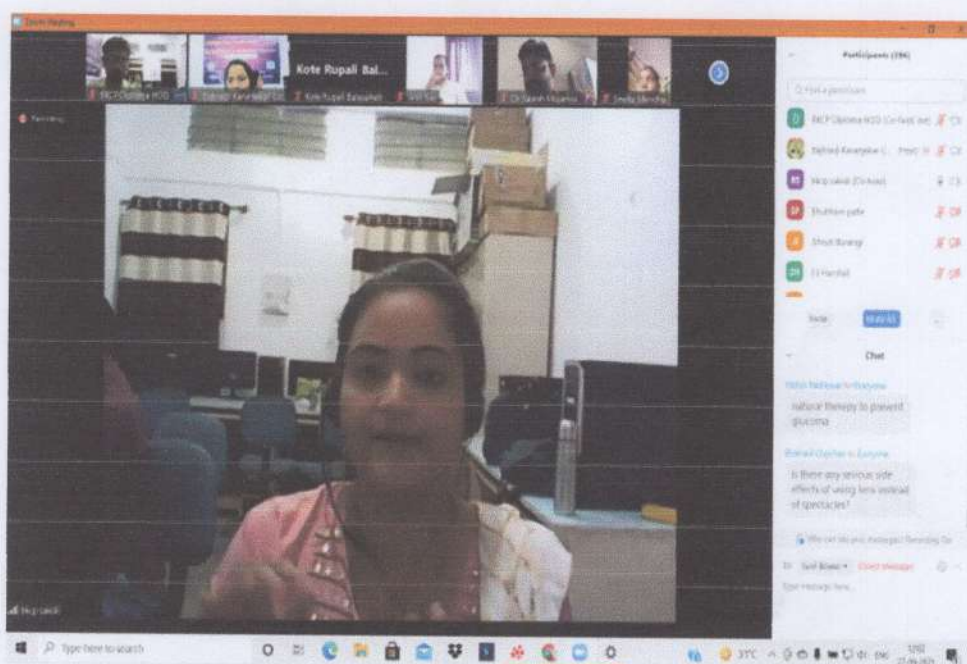

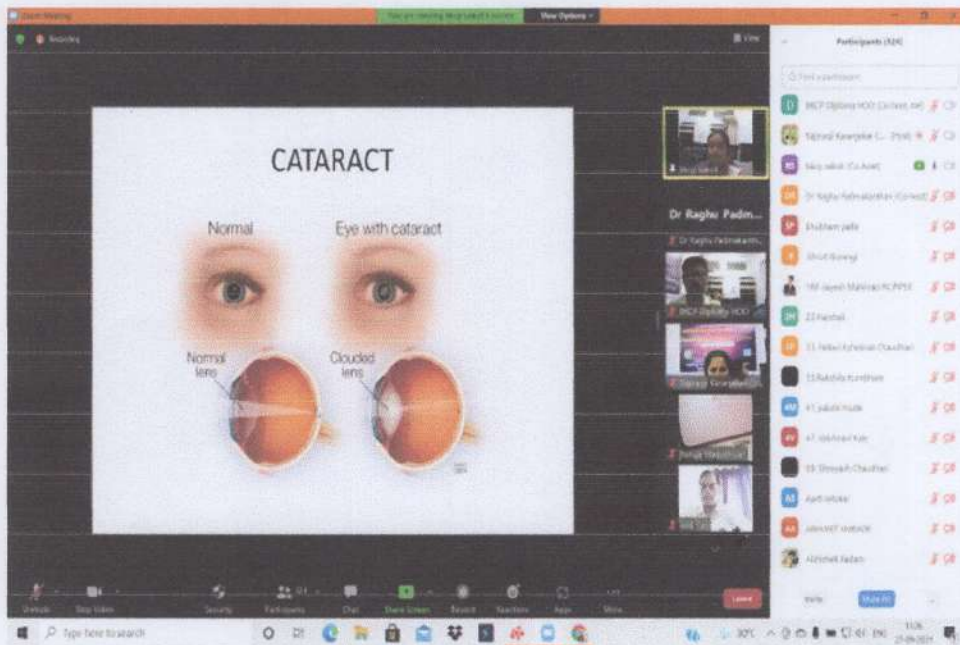
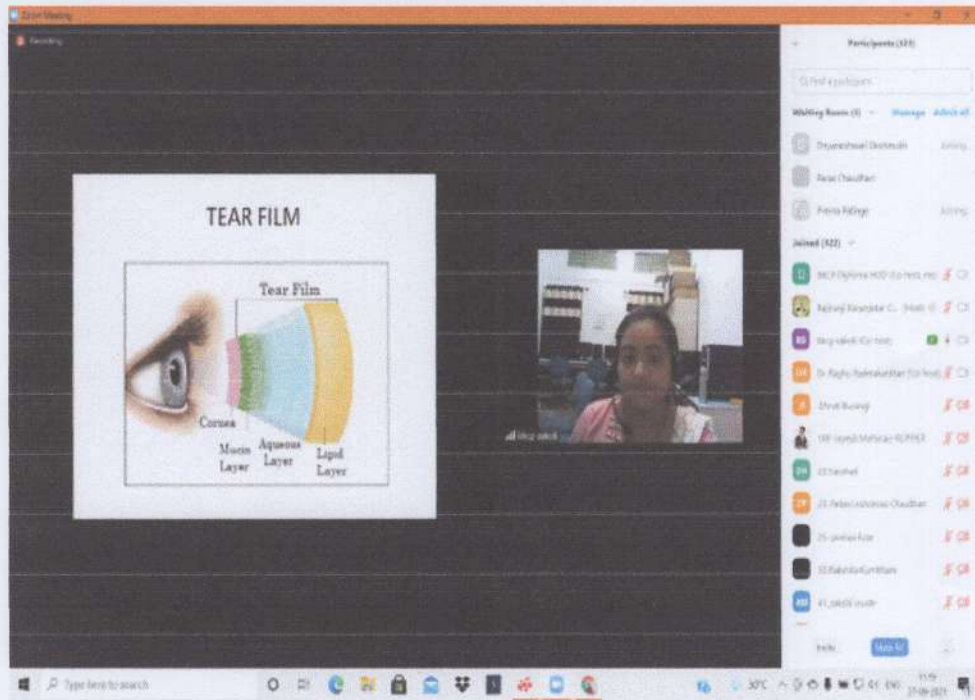
